Lokmanya Tilak is the 'Tilak' of India's freedom struggle: PM Modi

Pune/New Delhi : Expressing his respect for freedom fighter Lokmanya Tilak, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that Lokmanya Tilak is the Tilak on the forehead of our freedom history. The Prime Minister was conferred with the Lokmanya Tilak National Award in Pune, Maharashtra, today. The award was instituted by the Tilak Smarak Mandir Trust in 1983 to honour the legacy of Lokmanya Tilak. The Prime Minister has donated the prize money to the Namami Gange project. Addressing the gathering, the Prime Minister paid tribute to Lokmanya Tilak on his death anniversary and said it was a special day for him. Expressing his respect for both freedom fighter Lokmanya Tilak and social reformer Anna Bhau Sahre, the Prime Minister said,



"Lokmanya Tilak ji is the Tilak on the forehead of our freedom history, as well as the contribution that Anna Bhau also made for social reform. He is unique and extraordinary. I respectfully bow down at the feet of both of these great men."

The Prime Minister paid tribute to the land of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj, Chhatrapati Bhau, Jyotiba Phule, and Savitribai Phule. Earlier, the Prime Minister had offered prayers at the Dagdubeth temple

of Lokmanya Tilak in India's independence cannot be summed up in a few incidents or words. The Prime Minister said that today's situation is such that if we change the name of a road from the name of a foreign leader to the name of a famous Indian personality, some people will raise their voice against it. The Prime Minister said that the vision of system building to institution building, system building to individual building, and individual building to nation building acts as a roadmap for nation building. India today is diligently following this roadmap. He said that it is a matter of great fortune for me to receive the Lokmanya Tilak National Award from a place and an institution that have been directly associated with Tilak ji. I express my heartfelt

gratitude to Hind Swaraj Sangh and all of you for this honour. The Prime Minister said that when we get an award, our responsibility also increases. And when Tilak ji's name is associated with that award, the sense of responsibility increases manifold. I dedicate the Lokmanya Tilak National Award to 140 crore countrymen. He said that the British had created the impression that India's faith, culture, and beliefs were all symbols of backwardness. But Tilak ji also proved this wrong. That's why the people of India not only come forward themselves and gave recognition to Tilak ji but also gave him the title of Lokmanya. That is why Mahatma Gandhi also called him the creator of modern India.

Girder machine falls on a slab of the Samruddhi Express Highway in Thane, killing 15 people



Mumbai : Fifteen people were killed and three others injured when a girder launching machine engaged in the construction work of Phase III of the Samruddhi Express Highway collapsed near Shahuji in Maharashtra's Thane early today. Shahuji police gave this information.

The police said that this machine fell on the slab of the bridge. Two teams of the NDRF were on the spot. The rescue operation is on. So far, 15 bodies have been retrieved. NDRF says that six other people are believed to be trapped in the collapsed structure.

Commercial gas cylinders become cheaper; companies cut by Rs 99.75

New Delhi : Public sector oil and gas marketing companies have reduced the price of commercial gas cylinders by Rs 99.75. The new rates are effective from 1st August. According to the website of Indian Oil, now a 19 kg commercial gas cylinder will be available in Delhi for Rs 1650, which was earlier available for Rs 1750. In Kolkata, it will be available for Rs 1802.50, which was earlier available for Rs 1895.50. It will be available for Rs. 1640.50 in the country's financial capital, Mumbai. Earlier, its price was Rs. 1733.50. Its price in Chennai has come down to Rs. 1852.50 (with a reduction of Rs. 92.50). Earlier, it was available for Rs. 1945. Significantly, the price of commercial gas cylinders has been reduced by up to Rs 93 in Kolkata and Mumbai. Earlier on July 4, there was a marginal increase of Rs 7 in the price of commercial cylinders.

Leaving Earth's orbit, Chandrayaan-3, headed towards the Moon, will reach it on Aug 5



New Delhi : The important mission of the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is moving fast towards success in a phased manner. After completing the historic success of this mission, Chandrayaan-3 has left the Earth's orbit and is headed towards the Moon. ISRO had ejected Chandrayaan-3, which had circled all the orbits of the Earth, towards the Moon at midnight on August 1.

ISRO shared this achievement with the world by tweeting on Tuesday morning. ISRO has said that at the appointed time, the vehicle was turned on to eject it from the Earth's orbit, and it was sent on its way to the

moon by giving it sufficient acceleration. Now the next stop is the Moon. It will be placed in the Moon's orbit on August 5. Chandrayaan-3 was launched by ISRO on July 14. The Chandrayaan-3 spacecraft consists of a propulsion module (2,148 kg), a lander (1,723.89 kg), and a rover (26 kg). The moon objective of this mission is to land the lander safely on the lunar surface. The lander will separate from the propulsion module a few days after entering the lunar orbit. The lander is expected to soft land near the Moon's south pole at 5:47 p.m. on August 23. The lander will land on the Moon at an altitude of about 100 km from the lunar surface.

Ram Navami violence: NIA officials reach Shrirampur-Risda

Risda : In connection with the investigation of Ram Navami and the violence that followed, a team of NIA agents reached Risda police station at around 10 p.m. on Monday night. The NIA team members gathered information about the violence on Ram Navami by interacting with the police officers and collecting documents related to the case. In fact, riots broke out in Shrirampur-Risda during the Ram Navami procession on April 2. The violence continued on April 3 as well. On April 4, the governor

reached the violence-hit areas and appealed to the people for peace. Section 144 was in force in the area for several days, and internet service remained suspended. The High Court had ordered an NIA probe into the riots that broke out in Shrirampur-Risda on Ram Navami. After the High Court, the Supreme Court also upheld that order. After this, the central agency actively started the investigation. According to the Central Investigation Agency, it is currently busy collecting

documents related to the case. According to the information received, a team of four members of the NIA reached Risda police station at around 10 p.m. on Monday night. He talked to the police officers. According to sources, there was a discussion on what happened on the day of the incident and what action was taken in its wake. After collecting the documents from Risda police station, the NIA team went to Shrirampur police station and collected documents related to the case from there as well.

Rajya Sabha adjourned till noon and Lok Sabha till 2 pm

New Delhi : Rajya Sabha proceedings have been adjourned till 12 noon and Lok Sabha proceedings till 2 pm on Tuesday. Opposition slogans and uproar continued on Tuesday as soon as the proceedings began in both houses on the Manipur issue. In the Rajya Sabha, the Chairman said that government is a collective responsibility. It is not justified to remain adamant only on the basis of the Prime Minister's statement. In 2014 too, a similar demand made by Sitarum echoru was turned down by the Chair. The Chairman said that he had allowed a short discussion on Manipur on Monday but regretted that the proceedings of the House were disrupted.

No-confidence motion will be discussed in Lok Sabha from August 8 to 10

New Delhi : The no-confidence motion presented by the opposition coalition in the Lok Sabha will be discussed between August 8 and 10. Prime Minister Narendra Modi will reply to the discussion on Thursday, 10 August. This decision was taken in the Business Advisory Committee chaired by Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla. According to sources, the opposition demanded that the no-confidence motion be discussed first, but the government remained adamant on giving priority

to the Bills. Later, the opposition staged a walkout from the committee meeting. The opposition is creating ruckus in both the Houses of the Parliament demanding a detailed discussion on the Manipur issue. Due to this, the proceedings of both the Houses are being disrupted. The opposition wants the Prime Minister himself to give a statement on this in the House. Meanwhile, 17 fishermen on board the trawler have brought a no-confidence motion. The government has a sufficient majority in the Lok Sabha.

Trawler sinks in Bay of Bengal

Diamond Harbour : Once again a trawler full of fishermen overturned in the Bay of Bengal on Monday night. As per sources, despite warnings from the meteorological department, a trawler named PH Gangamayi was returning to the ghat late on Monday night while the sea was rough at that time. The trawler capsized due to waves at a depth of 25 km from Sitarampur in Patthalpattana. As per the latest information, there were 17 fishermen on board the trawler. When the trawler started sinking in the sea, the fishermen began shouting for help.



Another trawler which was nearby at that time came to their rescue and the 17 fishermen of the sinking trawler were saved. During rescue operation, the health of some fishermen deteriorated due to drowning in water. They were taken to Kalkdwip. However, a number of trawlers have been sent out to sea to retrieve the sunken trawler. Notably, this trawler had left Kalkdwip Ghat five days ago to catch Hilsa fish. The accident occurred while the trawler was returning to the ghat after catching Hilsa. Moreover, this is the third incident of trawler sinking in the Bay of Bengal in the last seven days.

Vital to respect and await verdict of court, says Mayawati on Gyanvapi issue

Lucknow : Mayawati, the supreme of the Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP), slammed Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's statement on the Gyanvapi issue on Tuesday, claiming that the controversial statements made by leaders of the Samajwadi Party (SP) and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) could be part of a political conspiracy by both parties. He is the BJP's statement raising controversy regarding the Gyanvapi case, which is pending in the court, following SP's statement regarding the construction of Badrinath



Temple by demolishing the Buddhist monastery not the result of a well-planned conspiracy between these two parties. Mayawati tweeted. This is a grave and coercive, she added. The Gyanvapi case is currently ongoing in the High Court on the Supreme Court's instruction about the disagreement of having the survey done by the ASI. Making any remark on this dispute is not only superfluous, but also unjust in this scenario. It is vital to respect and await the verdict of the court, opined Mayawati.

J&K registers 1.27 cr tourist arrivals this year: Sinha

Srinagar : Jammu and Kashmir's Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Tuesday said that this year so far 1.27 crore tourists have visited the UT and the number is all set to cross previous year's record. Addressing a gathering at Char-e-Sharief in Central Kashmir's Budgam district, the LG, showered praises on the revered saint Sheikh-ul-Alam Sheikh Nooruddin Noorani (RA) and said that world knows Sheikh-ul-Alam. The saint doesn't need to be introduced to anyone in the world as

he is Sheikh-ul-Alam not Sheikh-ul-Kashmir. The saint was an epitome of sufiism, the LG said. He said that a peaceful atmosphere is prevailing in Kashmir as business remains on throughout the year and schools and colleges are functioning normally. I keep on saying always that nothing is possible without peace. No development is possible unless peace is established. There was a time when a shikara owner, a hotel owner and a common auto-rickshaw owner would suffer a lot due to uncertainty. We

have come out of that phase, the LG said, adding that this year so far 1.27 Crore tourists have visited J&K and the figure is much higher than the last year. We hope to see record breaking tourist arrivals by the year end. He said when large number of tourists have started frequenting Kashmir, it was the prime duty of the administration to ensure quality infrastructure. We are setting up tourist infrastructure everywhere in the UT to give best facilities to our guests, he said.

When large number of guests would visit Kashmir, our local shopkeeper, taxi driver, hotel and shikara owner will earn and at the end, our economy will improve. He said that Kashmir University's full fledged Centre will come up at Budgam district and he will discuss the issue with the Vice-Chancellor KU shortly. About the district hospital in Budgam, he said that the hospital will offer all major facilities to people. It will not make claims of something that can't happen. I

won't make hollow promises so that if someone will replace me and will claim this was promised but didn't happen, he said. The LG said that so far, 30,000 youth got jobs and all were selected through transparent manner. Recruitment process will once again start from September this year, he said. Present on the occasion were Divisional Commissioner Vijay Kumar Bhidari, ADGP Kashmir Vijay Kumar, Secretary Tourism Syed Abid Rashid and other officials of the administration.
