Lokmanya Tilak is the 'Tilak' of India's freedom struggle: PM Modi

Pune/New Delhi: Expressing his respect for freedom fighter Lokmanya Tilak, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that Lokmanya Tilak is the Tilak on the forehead of our freedom history. The Prime Minister was conferred with the Lokmanya Tilak National Award in Pune, Maharashtra, today. The award was instituted by the Tilak Smarak Mandir Trust in 1983 to honour the legacy of Lokmanya Tilak. The Prime Minister has donated the prize money to the Narmada Ganga project. Addressing the gathering, the Prime Minister paid tribute to Lokmanya Tilak on his death anniversary and said it was a special day for him. Expressing his respect for both freedom fighter Lokmanya Tilak and social reformer Anna Bhau Sathe, the Prime Minister said,



Lokmanya Tilak ji is the Tilak on the forehead of our freedom history, as well as the contribution that Anna Bhau also made for social reform. He is unique and extraordinary. I respectfully bow down at the feet of both these great men.

The Prime Minister paid tribute to the land of Chhatrapati Shivaji, Chapekar Bhau, Jyotiba Phule, and Savitribai Phule. Earlier, the Prime Minister had offered prayers at the Dugdudheshwar temple

and sought blessings. The programme is a memorable moment for me, he said. I thank Hind Swaraj Sangh and all of you from the bottom of my heart for giving me the Lokmanya Tilak National Award. He said that I want to dedicate the prize money received today to the Narmada Ganga project. He said, "Lokmanya Tilak had a unique ability to spot young talent; Veer Savarkar was an example of this." He said that the role and contribution

of Lokmanya Tilak in India's independence cannot be summed up in a few words or words.

The Prime Minister said that today's situation is such that if we change the name of a road from the name of a foreign invader to the name of a famous Indian personality, some people will raise their voice against it. The Prime Minister said that the vision of system building to institutions building, 'system building' to individual building, and individual building to nation building, acts as a roadmap for nation building. India today is diligently following this roadmap. He said that it is a matter of great fortune for me to receive the Lokmanya Tilak National Award from a place and an institution that have been directly associated with Tilak ji. I express my heartfelt

gratitude to Hind Swaraj Sangh and all of you for this honour.

The Prime Minister said that when we get an award, our responsibility also increases. And when Tilak ji's name is associated with that award, the sense of responsibility increases manifold. I dedicate the Lokmanya Tilak National Award to 140 crore countrymen. He said that the British had created the impression that India's faith, culture, and beliefs were all symbols of backwardness. But Tilak ji also proved this wrong. That's why the people of India not only came forward themselves and gave recognition to Tilak ji but also gave him the title of Lokmanya. That is why Mahatma Gandhi has called him the creator of modern India.

Leaving Earth's orbit, Chandrayaan-3, headed towards the Moon, will reach it on Aug 5



New Delhi: The important mission of the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is moving fast towards success in a phased manner. After completing the historic success of this mission, Chandrayaan-3 has left the Earth's orbit and is headed towards the Moon. ISRO had ejected Chandrayaan-3, which had circled all the orbits of the Earth, towards the Moon at midnight on August 1.

ISRO shared this achievement with the world by tweeting on Tuesday morning. ISRO has said that at the appointed time, the vehicle was turned on to eject it from the Earth's orbit, and it was sent on its way to the

moon by giving it sufficient acceleration. Now the next stop is the Moon. It will be placed in the Moon's orbit on August 5. Chandrayaan-3 spacecraft consists of a propulsion module (2,148 kg), a lander (1,723.89 kg), and a rover (26 kg). The main objective of this mission is to land the lander safely on the lunar surface. The lander will separate from the propulsion module a few days after entering the lunar orbit. The lander is expected to soft-land near the Moon's south pole at 5:47 pm on August 23. The lander will land on the Moon at an altitude of about 100 km from the lunar surface.

Vital to respect and await verdict of court, says Mayawati on Gyanvapi issue

Lucknow : Mayawati, the supremo of the Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP), slammed Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's statement on the Gyanvapi issue on Tuesday, claiming that the controversial statement made by leaders of the Samajwadi Party (SP) and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) could be part of a political conspiracy between both parties.

"In the BSP's statement raising controversy regarding the Gyanvapi case, which is pending in the court, following SP's statement regarding the construction of Bednath



Temple by demolishing the Buddhist monastery, not the result of a well-planned conspiracy between these two parties. Mayawati furthered, it is gross and concerning," she added.

The Gyanvapi case is currently ongoing in the High Court. On the Supreme Court's instruction about the disqualification of having the survey done by the ASI. Making any remark on this dispute is not only superfluous, but also unjust in this scenario. It is vital to respect and await the verdict of the court, opined Mayawati.

J&K registers 1.27 cr tourist arrivals this year: Sinha

Srinagar : Jamia Masjid and Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Tuesday said that this year so far 1.27 crore tourists have visited J&K and the number is all set to cross previous year's record. Addressing a gathering at Charar-e-Sharif in Central Kashmir's Baramulla district, the LG, showered praises on the revered saint Sheikh-ul-Alam Sheikh Nooruddin Noorani (RA) and said that world knows Sheikh-ul-Alam. The saint doesn't need to be introduced to anyone in the world as he is Sheikh-ul-Alam, the said was an epitome of wisdom, the LG said. He said that a peaceful atmosphere is prevailing in Kashmir as business remains on throughout the year and schools and colleges are functioning normally. I keep on saying always that nothing is possible without peace. No development is possible unless peace is established. There was a time when a shikara owner, a hotel owner and a common auto-rickshaw owner would suffer a lot due to uncertainty. We

have come out of that phase, the LG said, adding that this year so far 1.27 crore tourists have visited J&K, and the figure is much higher than the last year. We hope to see record breaking tourist arrivals by the year end?

He said when large number of tourists have started frequenting Kashmir, it was the prime duty of the administration to ensure quality infrastructure. "We are setting up tourist infrastructures everywhere in the UT to give best facilities to our guests," he said.

When large number of tourists would date to Kashmir, our local shopkeeper, taxi driver, hotel and shikara owner will earn and at the end, our economy will improve?

He said that Kashmir University's full-fledged Centre will come up at Budgam district and he will discuss the issue with the Vice-Chancellor KU shortly. Mumbai : Fifteen people were killed and three others injured when a girder launching machine engaged in the construction work of Phase III of the Samruddhi Express Highway collapsed near Shalpuri in Maharashtra's Thane-sha today. Shalpuri police gave this information.

Commercial gas cylinders become cheaper; companies cut by Rs 99.75



New Delhi : Public-sector oil and gas marketing companies have reduced the price of commercial gas cylinders by Rs 99.75. The new rates are effective.

According to the website of Indian Oil, now a 19 kg commercial gas cylinder will be available in Delhi for Rs 1,680, which was earlier available for Rs 1,780. In Kolkata and Mumbai, earlier, it was available for Rs 1,602.50, which was earlier available for Rs 1,895.50. It

will be available for Rs 1,640.50 in the country's financial capital, Mumbai. Earlier, its price was Rs 1,733.50. Its price in Chennai has come down to Rs. 1,652.50 (with a reduction of Rs. 92.50). Earlier, it was available for Rs. 1,945.

Significantly, the price of commercial gas cylinders has been reduced by up to Rs 93 in Kolkata and Mumbai. Earlier on July 4, there was a marginal increase of Rs. 7 in the price of commercial cylinders.

Rajya Sabha adjourned till noon and Lok Sabha till 2 pm

New Delhi : Rajya Sabha proceedings have been adjourned till 12 noon and Lok Sabha proceedings till 2 pm on Tuesday. Opposition slogans and taupar continued on Tuesday as soon as the proceedings began in both houses on the Manipur issue. In the Rajya Sabha, the Chairman said that government is a collective

responsibility. It is not justified to remain adamant only on the basis of the Prime Minister's statement.

In 2014 too, a similar demand made by Sitaram Yechury was turned down by the Chair. The Chairman said that he had allowed a short discussion on Manipur on Monday but regretted that the proceedings of the House were disrupted.

Trawler sinks in Bay of Bengal



Diamond Harbour : Once again a trawler full of fishermen overturned in the Bay of Bengal on Monday night. As per sources, despite warnings from the meteorological department, a trawler named PB Gangamayi was returning to the ghat late on Monday night while the sea was rough at that time. The trawler capsized due to waves at a depth of 25 km from Siltsampur in Patharghatima.

As per the latest information, there were 17 fishermen on board the trawler. When the trawler started sinking in the sea, the fishermen began shouting for help. Another trawler which was nearby at that time came to their rescue and the 17 fishermen of the sinking trawler were saved. During the rescue operation, the health of some fishermen deteriorated due to drowning in water. They were taken to Kakkawep. However, a number of trawlers have been sent

out to sea to retrieve the stranded trawler. Notably, this trawler had left Kakkawep Ghat five days ago to catch Hilsa fish. The accident occurred while the trawler was returning to the ghat after catching Hilsa. Moreover, this is the third incident of trawler sinking in the Bay of Bengal in the last seven days.
